### Tuesday 4th June 2024

#### Tennis v Radley College

#### Athletics: HSAA County Championships. Portsmouth

Eleven WinColl athletes had gained selection to represent Eastleigh & Winchester schools at the Hampshire Schools' Athletics Championships in Portsmouth. First up was Athletics' Captain Gus B (F) who won the Senior Boys 400m hurdles and in the process broke the school record. Gus also claimed the high jump county title and was 2<sup>nd</sup> in the 110m Hurdles – a superb day's work. Other senior medallists on the day were Cookites Jad G, taking 2<sup>nd</sup> in the SB Shot Put and Discus and Jeffrey C runner up in the SB Long Jump. There were third places finishes for Kaito KW (F) in the SB 400m and Anthony CB (B) in the SB 200m.

Amongst the younger age groups, Felix C (E) finished 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Inter Boys 100m Hurdles and Osamede A (G) threw a huge pb in the Junior Boys Shot to claim first place. There were commendable performances also from Issa D (I) in the Inter Boys 800m, Ivor M (G) in the IB 1500m, Seb B (G) in the IB long jump and 200m and Ed F (B) in the long jump too. (MSB)



#### Cricket v St. Edward's School, Oxford

We returned to St Edward's on Saturday to play our 50 over match in the John Harvey trophy. Henry again won the toss and elected to field.

The same two St Edwards' openers from last night's match came in and attacked from the start. Unfortunately, we were unable to be consistent enough with both our lines and lengths, despite Henry trying to find the right combination of bowlers. The two openers had put on 143 in just over 20 overs, when George managed to break the partnership. The other opener continued to play well punishing anything short or too full, scoring an excellent hundred. At one stage a score of over 400 looked possible, but once again the lads showed good spirit, Alex and Stan in particular bowling good second spells and St Edward's closed on 356-6.

We needed a really positive start, but alas found ourselves 8-2, with Charlie and James both dismissed. However, a good partnership of 54 between Henry and Stephen gave us a little hope although the required run rate was climbing all the time. We then lost regular wickets against good disciplined bowling and found ourselves 77-6. Nevertheless, Rhys initially, and then Stan gave their captain good support, Rhys making 28 of 29 balls and Stan 34 off 25 balls. Henry once again was our mainstay scoring 76 but we were all out for 183 from 43 overs.

## Sailing BSDRA Thames Valley Championships (a):

Arriving at Datchet Water Sailing Club on Saturday, there was a solid breeze blowing across the lake. The reservoir is built above ground level so it always has good breeze, and while not sailing you can see Windsor Castle on the far side of the lake, and watch the planes taking off from Heathrow which is about two miles away. Given the nice central location, 20 teams came to battle it out for the Thames Valley Area Championships.

Our teams arrived in buoyant mood, this being the first event for some time (perhaps since before the pandemic) that we were able to field two full Firefly teams of 6 sailors each. Winchester Blue consisted of Hensher (helm), Hollard (crew), Balmain (helm), Fitzwilliams (crew), Edwards (helm) and Bonsall (crew). Winchester Red consisted of A Parkinson (helm), Warner (crew), Büchner (helm), Varouxakis Thomas (crew), Amelie (helm) and Huxley (crew).

The event was sailed in cutdowns (smaller sails) due to the strong breeze. From my position on the finish boat (recording boats as they cross the line) I wasn't able to see much of the racing, but the teams had some well-contested races and learnt a lot. In the end, both teams won four of their eight races, with Winchester Blue placing 8th/20 in the event overall, and Red 11th/20. But I think that these positions do not tell the full tale - there was some very competitive racing at the top of the fleet and the races lost against the teams who eventually came near the top of the table were hard-fought battles not walk-overs.

We were very pleased to field two teams and given that most of the sailors involved will still be with us in the new academic year this is very promising for future development of the squad. [JAAB]
